











TO PARENTS AND TEACHERS

This Activity Kit is designed as a fun and educational follow up to the nine different videos that are available on the Treehouse YouTube Channel! Each video will present Oliver, our enthusiastic puzzle piece and the hero in our series, facing a social dilemma. By the end of the episode, Oliver will discover an important principle about social relationships.

As parents and teachers, we know that "fitting in" is an important and sometimes difficult process for children. It is known as socio-emotional development. It incorporates four major steps:

Self-Awareness: Children need to learn "Who am I?" Understanding their uniqueness

and developing self-confidence are critical to "fitting in" with their peers.

Social Awareness: Children need to understand that friends can be similar to them

in some ways but different in other ways. They need to learn to respect diversity and the fact that friends may react to situations in

different ways.


Moral Framework: A child's moral framework or ethics (being honest, telling the truth, etc.)

underpin a child's behavior. Children need to identify and apply core principles and recognize the consequences of their actions.

Skills for These include managing one's emotions, responsible decision-making, **Social Interactions:** developing communication skills, resilience in achieving goals,

and creative thinking.

We encourage you to watch the videos with your child, and then to have fun with the activity and coloring pages! If your child is a non-reader, they may need your help. We also encourage you to use the message inherent in the video and relate it to situations that are relevant to your own family, your classroom and the child.





TRAIN TROUBLES


Oliver learns that he and his friends can still find a way to play together even though they have differing interests and abilities!


ACTIVITY


Oliver wants to play with the Train Tots! They are all train cars that work together, but not all of them are the same. FIND and CIRCLE the two Train Tots that are the same!




Parents: Please read the instructions if your child is a non-reader.












Remember, everyone is unique and there are lots of different ways to play with your friends.






FARM FRIENDS FUN

Oliver knows his friends are happy with their new barn just by looking at them!




TALL TOWER TRIUMPH

Always think before you speak! You want to use happy words with your friends!




TWO STARS ARE BORN

matching picture!


WEARS GLASSES

Just have fun!




BIG BUBBLE BOO-BOO

A TRICKY TAKEOFF


Grandpa teaches Oliver how to make a paper airplane.
